

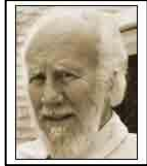

My professional career has been spent primarily in Academia, as a teacher in psychology courses like personality theory or personality testing, and as an investigator in carrying out laboratory research on dreams. In the dream lab, I have been both the researcher attaching electrodes to the sleeping subjects, and also the sleeping subject volunteering to have electrodes attached to my head in four different laboratories. These latter activities were most frequently carried out to investigate my abilities as a telepathic receiver, and my results were generally considered to be successful, both by my standards and those of Drs. Montague Ullman and Stanley Krippner. I also did some fieldwork investigating telepathic dreaming with the Kuna Indians in Panama.

My roots with Atlantic University are rather wide and long standing. More than 30 years ago, I ran a month long workshop on *Dreams and Shamanism* with Dr. Henry Reed, and I assisted Janis and Fred Davidson in a workshop on *Dreams and Creativity*. These were held on John La Prell's farm in Rural Retreat. I also served on the Research Committee back then.

During my 83-year tenure on this side of the veil, I have experienced cancer (angiosarcoma) that resulted in losing my entire nose, and I have also lost three sons in separate events over the years. Acceptance of the reality of a spiritual domain has sustained me through these challenges.
